



The Bhoomi Pooja of the Brigade Terraces on Cambridge Road was performed on the 15th of December 2000. The project is designed to be





Legal Eye

BDA amends site allotment rules

The Bangalore Development Authority (BDA) has amended its Site Allotment Rules, providing among others, enabling the spouse or one of the legal heirs of an applicant who dies before allotment of site to claim the site, with a view to eliminate hardships caused to site allottees. The amendment also puts an end to the lease-cum-sale agreement, and provide for issuing an absolute sale Deed immediately after the allottee pays the full sital value, eliminating the long wait of 10 years for obtaining the absolute sale Deed, according to an official press release. Further, the present amendment enables an allottee who holds a lease-cum-sale agreement under the old Rules to opt for an absolute sale Deed before the expiry of stipulated 10 years period, without having to pay fine for keeping the site vacant. An allottee for this purpose has to submit an application for absolute sale Deed along with necessary documents, such as, encumbrance certificate, attested specimen signature and photograph, four passport size photographs, no objection certificate from the organisation concerned in case of loan on the site, latest tax paid receipt and an affidavit as to the validity of the general power of attorney in case the allottee has assigned general power of attorney.

OFFICE WORK-*OUT*

Over a period of time, desk jobs and air-conditioned environments lead to accumulation of gases

BANGALORE AIRPORT ALL SET FOR TAKE OFF

The Bangalore airport which bagged international status recently is all set to get a facelift. The Airport Authority of India (AAI) has drawn up an action plan to project the Bangalore airport as a showpiece of Karnataka. Many international airlines including the Singaporean airlines have come forward asking for landing rights. Meanwhile the IT sector is putting pressure on the state and central governments for more direct flights from Bangalore to the US and European countries. Confirming the move, Infosys chief Mr. Narayana Murthy said "With Bangalore playing a lead role in software exports, it is extremely important to have operations from this centre to other parts of the world. We have written to the Govt. of India and AAI to make this dream come true."

The officials are gearing up for round the clock international flights and claim that they can accommodate even wide booted aircraft like the Boeing-747 and airbuses. The Bangalore City Corporation has taken up beautification work on the approach and exit roads to the airport.

How Kempe Gowda marked the four corners of Bangalore.



Kempe Gowda was a feudal lord who served the Vijayanagara Kingdom. During one of his hunting bouts, he was surprised to see a hare chase his dog. Either his dog was chicken hearted or the hare was lion hearted, one does not know, but the episode surely made an impression on the feudal lord. He told himself that this was a place worthy enough for heroes and henceforth he

referred to Bangalore as "gandu bhoomi" (land of heroes). Kempe Gowda I, who was in charge of Yelahanka, built a mud fort in 1537. With the help of King Achutaraya, he built the townships of Balepet, Cottonpet, and Chickpet, all inside the fort. Today, these townships are commercial hubs of the city. Kempe Gowda II built four watch towers to mark the boundary of Bangalore. The towers have stood the test of time and still exist as of today.
