

UR country is experiencing a crisis of confidence. The sudden and sharp depreciation in the value of the rupee has caught the political establishment and the corporate world off guard. Why has this happened? To put it simply, it is because of complacency, deficiency in governance and a series of scams of very high proportion. When India was Shining with 9% GDP growth, the governing fraternity thought India was moving towards super power status and took the liberty of making a series of bad decisions and introducing socialistic schemes, which India could ill afford. With BRIC countries' steady growth in the past few years, it was felt that the United States' influence over the world had

reduced. But the USA has once again proved that 'if it sneezes, the world still catches a cold' (this time by way of 'Quantitative Easing'). For India to get out of this mess, it is essential to focus on strengthening its economic fundamentals rather than trying to depend on FII hot money.



owever sound the intentions behind I socialistic schemes like NREGA, RTE and the Food Security Bill may be, they are bound to adversely impact our country's current account deficit-primarily because of our record of very poor delivery and execution,

resulting in huge leakages. As a developing country, we are not in a position to fritter away lakhs of crores of rupees. If the same amount is spent, year after year, on employment generation projects rather than doles, it would help in selfsustenance of the poor. The old proverb of 'teaching a man to fish, rather than feeding him fish' is what needs to be done. The deadly combination of socialistic schemes of the central and state governments will have a huge negative effect on the availability and productivity of labour willing to work, in spite of our having a population of 1.23 billion.



If the government continues to act on the basis of political  $oldsymbol{I}$  expediency and the 2014 parliamentary elections, the only thing left for citizens is to pray for the economy to stabilise on its own and to also pray for a stable central government to be elected in 2014. Luckily, the people of Karnataka have got a stable government after many years of instability.



In an otherwise precarious situation, a silver lining may f I be that Indian exports will become substantially more competitive and may result in exports exceeding imports, leading to current account surplus.

Tven at this stage, it is heartening to know that international investors still think the long term India story is good, due to its population and resultant demand, and the possibility of graduating from a developing country to a developed country.



ne needs to have hope. To quote Barack Obama, "Hope in the face of difficulty. Hope in the face of uncertainty .... A belief that there are better days ahead." Based on this hope, we in Brigade Group will continue to plan to start more projects in the cities in which we operate. The two recent launches-Brigade Golden Triangle on Old Madras Road

#### Making space for culture




That Bangalore has a vibrant and growing cultural scene has never been disputed, but is the cultural infrastructure of the city keeping pace? Most young musicians, dancers and theatre persons in the city feel that to truly encourage the arts, Bangalore needs more spaces and a larger variety of well-equipped venues.

The onus of creating such spaces lies with the government as well as civil society, feels Koilpillai (Preetam Koilpillai, Director, Black Coffee Productions). "I think the responsibility should be

a collective one. The best spaces that are available now have been built by passionate individuals who are seriously interested in the arts. If the government can contribute more significantly to these efforts, we'd have far more and better-equipped spaces than we do now", he says.

- 1. Widening Current Account Deficit: This is resulting in creating more actual as well as speculative demand for the dollar and other convertible currencies.
- 2. Policy Inaction: Perception of lack of clarity on policy front is also fanning speculative demand.
- 3. Low Forex Reserves: India's Forex reserves are enough to cover imports of seven months only. Due to low reserves, the RBI can't intervene aggressively in the currency markets.
- 4. Economic Growth Slowdown: India's GDP growth fell to a decade low of 5% in 2012-13. Foreign investors are pulling money out of the Indian markets due to slow growth.
- 5. Dependence on Foreign Money: Withdrawal of money by overseas investors is leading to the weakness in the rupee.
- 6. Recovery in the US: The slow but steady recovery in the US is making the greenback stronger against other currencies.
- 7. Stimulus Withdrawal: Indications that the US may withdraw or ease the fiscal stimulus package that has been on since a few years ago to tide over the economic crisis there, could potentially put the brakes on funds for developing economies.
- 8. Capital Controls: The decision by RBI and the government to impose temporary restrictions on capital flows will not only discourage Indian companies from investing abroad, but also foreign firms from pumping money into India.
- 9. Trends in other markets: The rupee is also following the trend seen in the currencies of other emerging economies.
- **10.Speculative Trading:** Speculative trading in the currency markets is putting further pressure on the Indian rupee.

#### Bill in Rajya Sabha to regulate real estate

Introducing the Real Estate (Regulation and Development) Bill 2013 in the Rajya Sabha recently, Housing Minister Girija Vyas said the bill seeks to establish the Real Estate Regulatory Authority to protect the interest of consumers in the real estate sector. Ms Vyas also said the bill is for regulation and promotion of the real estate sector and to ensure sale of plot, apartment or building, as the case may be, in an efficient and transparent manner.

Under the bill, there will be a model builder-buyer agreement which is expected to reduce ambiguities in real estate transactions that many buyers are unfamiliar with. Real estate agents will also be asked to register with the regulator. Agents, an important link between the promoter and buyer, have been an unregulated lot till now.

For fast tracking settlement of disputes, an adjudicating officer not below joint secretary in the state will be appointed by the authority. There will also be a Real Estate Appellate Tribunal that will hear appeals from orders, decisions or directions of regulator and adjudicating officer. —Sources: Tol, 6 June and The Hindu, 15 Aug

## "Atmano mokshartham jagat bitana cha"

"For one's own salvation and for the welfare of the world"

150 years after his birth, Narendranath Datta is remembered and revered as a major philosopher, patriot, humanitarian and yogi. He founded the Ramakrishna Mission, played a pivotal role in the revival of Hinduism in India and in its introduction to the western world. In India, Vivekananda is considered a patriotic saint and his birthday is celebrated as National Youth Day. The statue of him that we installed in Vivekananda Park (see cover) reflects our respect for a man who touched minds and hearts around the world.

Narendranath Datta was born in 1863. One of nine siblings, he belonged to an aristocratic family in Kolkata. He led a privileged life, went to the best educational institutions, and excelled in music, gymnastics and academics. He seemed like any other Bengali boy of his times, except for the fact that he showed a spiritual turn of mind from a very young age. In college, however, Narendra went through a period of spiritual doubt and confusion, even questioning the existence of God. It was then that one of his professors told him about a sage, Sri Ramakrishna. Intrigued, the 18-year-old went to meet Sri Ramakrishna, who was then staying at the Kali Temple in Dakshineshwar.

Sri Ramakrishna did not know Sanskrit; his knowledge of Hindu texts and epics was through hearing them recited. But his spirituality was both deep and profound; an intense contemplation of God. He worshipped with Muslims and Christians, and propounded religious tolerance. He spoke in simple language and used aphorisms, parables and metaphors to explain complex ideas. His teachings drew people of all ages, social strata and economic backgrounds. In him, Narendra

found a spiritual advisor who would change his life.

## A new monastic order

Narendra became a constant visitor to Dakshineshwar and formed deep bonds with other young disciples he met there. Then fate dealt a harsh blow: Sri Ramakrishna was diagnosed with cancer. In 1885, he was moved to Cossipore, where he was attended to devotedly by his young

disciples. The group was led by Narendra. Living together, united in a common belief and cause, the group absorbed the spirit of renunciation and brotherly love propounded by their guru. They wore the ochre robes he gave them and followed

his order to beg for food. When Sri Ramakrishna died in 1886, his brotherhood of disciples moved into a crumbling building at Baranagar, North Kolkata. Then, one year after their guru's passing, they took the vows of sanyasa and adopted new names. Narendra, in time, became known as Swami Vivekananda.



In 1888, Vivekananda left the math and began life as a wandering

#### A voyage of discovery

Vivekananda felt he had to fulfill a greater mission in life. So he began a journey that took him throughout India. He was appalled and moved by the poverty of the masses He did not hesitate to speak his mind, becoming the first Indian religious leader to attribute India's condition to the oppression and neglect of the masses. He advocated education of two types: secular knowledge to improve their economic condition and spiritual knowledge to empower them with confidence and faith in their ability to succeed.

#### The Ramakrishna Mission is born

To achieve these goals, Vivekananda realised he needed the support of men and women who would dedicate themselves to the upliftment of the masses. He wanted "to set in motion machinery which will bring noblest ideas to the doorstep of even the poorest and the meanest." The Ramakrishna Mission was created in 1897 to achieve these lofty objectives. Theirs was a concept 'Practical Vedanta' and they embarked on social service initiatives to help the suffering masses through educational, cultural, medical and relief work.

#### **Beyond Indian borders**

The World's Parliament of Religions, an inter-faith congress, was scheduled to be held in Chicago in 1893. At the urging of his disciples, Vivekananda decided to attend. His goals were two-fold: to present his Guru's teachings and to raise money for India's underprivileged and downtrodden masses. He set sail for America on 31 May 1893. The

speeches he delivered at the World's Parliament of Religions won him respect not only for his enlightened philosophy, but also for his masterful oratory. The next three years saw him

travelling to different parts of the world, preaching the teachings of his Guru.

#### Vivekananda's impact in India

On his return to India in 1897, Vivekananda gave lectures all over the country. He aspired to see the birth of a more equal and harmonious

society; one in which people would have pride in their cultural and religious heritage; become involved in bettering the lives of the poor, sick and displaced; and focus on the commonalities that bound people together rather than the differences.




#### Ramakrishna Math

Vivekananda set up the Ramakrishna Math in Belur, near Kolkata. He consecrated the grounds in 1898 by worshipping the urn containing the sacred relics of Sri Ramakrishna. On that occasion he said, "The blazing light of universal harmony that will

emanate from here will flood the whole world." The Math and the Mission together have 176 branch centres all over India and in different parts of the world.

#### The last days

The year after establishing his Belur Math, Vivekananda made a second

trip to the USA, delivering lectures and explaining the ideas and ideals of Sri Ramakrishna. He returned to the Belur Math in 1900 and was soon absorbed in training his disciples, shaping the organisation's goals and imparting the teachings of his guru and himself to monks and laymen alike. The pace he set for himself began to tell on

his health, which deteriorated slowly. He passed away, while in deep meditation, on 4 July 1902. He was just 39 years old. —Team Insight
